



Continuing Medical Education Requirements For Transition to Continuous-Certification

1. Diplomates must attest to meeting the subspecialty-specific continuing medical education (CME) requirements for lifelong learning activities during the time-limited period of their certificate as outlined in the *CME Transition Requirements Table*. Diplomates must attest that all CME subspecialty-specific requirements have been met by December 2, 2019, at which time they will be transitioned to C-cert and their certification status will be listed as “Certified – Meeting Requirements.”
2. UCNS reserves the right to request documentation that supports a diplomate’s CME attestation. Diplomates must provide the documentation within 30 days of the request.
3. Diplomates are not required to attest to or submit documentation for any non-subspecialty CME credits.
4. Diplomates who do not meet or attest to the subspecialty CME requirement prior to December 2, 2019 will have their certification status listed as “Certified – Not Meeting Requirements” until all requirements are met per the policy.
5. Diplomates will be notified when the online attestation feature is available on the UCNS website, estimated to be by May 1, 2019.
