



Neuroimaging Subspecialty Membership Approved and Behavioral Neurology & Neuropsychiatry Programs Accredited

The United Council for Neurologic Subspecialties (UCNS) has approved its sixth subspecialty membership. The neurological subspecialty area of Neuroimaging was approved for membership by the UCNS Board in July 2006. The Neuroimaging application for membership was sponsored by the American Society of Neuroimaging.

Membership in the UCNS is the first step in the UCNS accreditation and certification process. The UCNS Accreditation Council will now work with the Neuroimaging subspecialty on requirements for fellowship programs. Then programs will be able to apply to become accredited by the UCNS. The UCNS Certification Council via its Examination Committee will also work with the subspecialty to develop the examination that will be used in certifying individuals in the subspecialty.
