

## Neuro-oncology Program Requirement V.B. Fellow Eligibility

- 1. The fellow must possess a current valid and unrestricted license to practice medicine in the United States or its territories or Canada.
- 2. The fellow must be a graduate of a residency program in neurology, child neurology, neurological surgery, <u>radiation oncology</u>, internal medicine and medical oncology, or pediatrics and pediatric hematology-oncology accredited by ACGME, RCPSC, or CanERA.
  - a. Fellows who have completed post-graduate training in an ACGME-, RCPSC, or CanERA-accredited medical oncology or pediatric hematology-oncology fellowship, or have completed a minimum of one year of an ACGME- or Can-ERA accredited medical oncology or pediatric hematology-oncology fellowship may also be eligible for enrollment; however, the Neuro-oncology fellowship will not be deemed complete until the successful completion of the medial oncology or pediatric hematology-oncology fellowship program. Appropriate documentation regarding the enrollment status of the fellow must be provided to UCNS.
- 3. The fellow must be board certified or eligible for certification by the ABMS, RCPSC, AOA, or CFPC in neurology, child neurology, neurosurgery-neurological surgery, medical or pediatric oncology, radiation oncology, or neuropathology. The fellow is also eligible if board certified or eligible for certification in internal medicine or pediatrics and with proof of enrollment in an ACGME- or CanERA-accredited medical oncology or pediatric hematology-oncology fellowship program.
